MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT BURTON VILLAGE HALL, HIGHBURTON ON THURSDAY, 6TH MARCH 2014 AT 7.30 pm

Apologies were received from Cllrs R Barraclough, R Burton, A Munro, P Pankhurst and L Parsley, R Thomas, the reasons for which were accepted by the Council. Cllrs H Barraclough, S Dunford and R Edmunds were absent.

224 Apologies and Declarations of Interest

The Chairman welcomed Mr Bradley to the meeting and the members introduced themselves.

The following personal interests were declared:

Cllr B Armer in planning application 90460 as he knows the applicant; Cllr K Dunn in planning application 90093 as he knows the agent; Cllr D Hardcastle in planning applications 90271 and 90346 as he knows the applicants.

The local Police gave a verbal update on incidents in the area.

225 Public Participation

A Stocksmoor resident addressed the Council on the proposed planning application 90460 in Cross Lane, Stocksmoor.

Resolved: To hold all items in the public session.

227 Change of Business

Members discussed the proposed outline planning application for erection of dwellings on Cross Lane in Stocksmoor. The following objections were made: There are severe drainage issues that already exist and cause problems for local residents; there is one route in and out of Stocksmoor and there will be highways issues should the development be approved; Stocksmoor is a rural village and any loss of land will lose rural ambience; trains are unreliable from the local train station and there are no facilities in the village; the broadband provision is very poor; the environment will be harmed – there are a lot of bats and badgers in the area; it has been noted in local guides that the open countryside around Stocksmoor is very beautiful and Stocksmoor is detailed in one guide as “the area is in a place of special landscape”.

Resolved: The Clerk to register opposition to the proposed development with the Planning Department and to ask Kirklees to reject the application.

Members received a presentation from the young people on the Youth Engagement Project, developed by pupils attending schools in the Shelley Pyramid. The young people were warmly congratulated for their efforts.

- Members considered sharing the hosting costs of the website with Denby Dale Parish Council and had a discussion. It was noted that Denby Dale had already agreed to fund half of the costs. **238 Townsweb Archive Website**
- Resolved:** To approve covering 50% of the hosting costs of the Townsweb archive website, with this year's costs being taken out of the budgets for Public Information and Environment.

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Members considered the additional information received and had a discussion on how to proceed. It was noted that Council has already agreed for the Chairman and Vice Chairman to go round all of the schools to explain the significance and reasons for the children being given poppy seeds to plant. Members considered if this was a duplication of the Kirkburton Area Committee project.

240 Commemoration of the Start of World War 1

Resolved: To allocate £50 to purchase the poppy seeds and to agree that the Chairman and Vice Chairman will only visit the 4 primary schools in the King James school pyramid to avoid an overlap with the Area Committee project.

Members considered nominating delegate/s to attend the event to be held on Thursday 10th July in Harrogate.

241 NALC 1-Day Conference: Making Localism Work

Resolved: To nominate Cllr J Hirst to attend the event. To also reserve 2 additional places under the Clerk's delegated authority so other councillors may attend if they wish.

The members were asked to notify the Clerk as soon as possible in order to secure a place and the preferred workshops.

Members noted the correspondence received and considered the suggestion of holding an Open Day to coincide with the Open Gardens Day in June.
